"Time Traveller" (drama) by Steve Kenny. Forty Foot Pictures.

A "Back to the Future"-obsessed Traveller boy strives to finish his own DeLorean replica before his family are evicted from their halting site.

Steve Kenny is an Irish Writer-Director based between London and Dublin, whose debut short film Coil won Best Student Film at the Kerry Film Festival 2015 and marked him as a talent to watch. TIME TRAVELLER, Steve's second short, won the Light In Motion Award for Best Irish Short at the Foyle Film Festival 2017, and both the Jury Special Mention Award and the Audience Award for Best Short at the Dublin International Film Festival 2018. The film also introduces us to the prodigious talent of breakout star Tom Doran and has been selected to screen at innumerable prestigious international Film Festivals including Tribeca, Cinequest, and Oberhausen amongst others. https://www.stevekennyfilm.com/
